

- 2007–09 Nevada State Legislature funded SB558/579 \$109,590 for music therapy instruments, equipment, supplies, and software (\$58,815 allocated to CCTA).
- 2006-08 Advocacy at Nellis Air Force Base is resulting in Music4Life programs in demand to serve deployed military personnel challenged with stress and PTSD.
- 2007 Child, adolescent and adult referrals at Sunrise Children’s Hospital were funded by Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Foundation in Nevada. Client profiles include children, siblings and parents affected by cancer.
- 2006–present Internship site affiliations with universities in New York, California, Oregon, Texas, and Arizona for undergraduate and postgraduate music and art therapy students.
- 2006–present Adolescent and adult referrals are funded by City of Henderson’s Therapeutic Recreation Division. Client profiles include intellectual and physical disabilities, autism, down syndrome, cerebral palsy, sensory integration dysfunction, seizures, vision and hearing impairment.
- 2004-present Child and adolescent referrals at Child Haven and Clark County Schools are funded through Children’s Service Guild, Nevada Arts Council, Nevada Mental Health Planning Advisory Council and MGM Mirage VOICE Foundation. Client profiles include stress, post-traumatic stress disorder, abuse, intellectual and physical disabilities, autism, behavioral disorders (e.g., defiance, ADD/ADHD, anti-social, aggression), substance abuse, depression, grief/loss, and anxiety.
